










Emergency Contraception

	<p>Emergency contraception is used by women to stop them getting pregnant</p>
	<p>A woman may want emergency contraception if they have had sex without using any other contraception</p>
  	<p>There are 2 kinds of emergency contraception</p> <p>The morning after pill</p> <p>The morning after pill has to be taken within 72 hours of having unprotected sex</p>
  	<p>Or</p> <p>The coil or IUD</p> <p>The coil can be fitted up to 5 days after having unprotected sex</p>
	<p>You can get advice about emergency contraception from your GP, Practice Nurse, Family Planning Clinic or chemist</p>
